HELP COMMITTEE LAUNCHES RE-DESIGNED WEBSITE

Washington, D.C. – U.S. Senator Mike Enzi (R-WY), Chairman of the Senate Health, Education, Labor and Pensions (HELP) Committee, today announced the unveiling of a newly re-designed, more user-friendly Committee website. The new site allows users to more easily and quickly access information regarding the Committee’s activities, including an up-to-the-minute calendar listing schedule of hearings and mark-ups.

“We made this investment in re-designing our website to bring our constituents closer to the Committee’s work and to educate the nation about the strides we are making to ensure accessible health care, a quality education, competitive workforce skills, and secure retirements for all Americans,” said Enzi.

The new website is designed to be more user-friendly and accessible. To that end, it offers current news updates and press releases, as well as links to federal departments and agencies that oversee the areas of health, education, labor, and pensions. It also allows users to contact the committee with any questions, concerns, or comments, and provides them with an easy-to-use, Google-powered search engine. Users can also view testimony from previous and current Committee hearings and roundtables.

“The internet is a vital tool for gathering important information about the business of our nation,” Enzi said. “Promoting the use of the latest technologies to improve the access of all Americans to critical resources is essential to my work as a Senator and as the Chairman of the HELP Committee.”

Visitors to the new website can access the following:

- A detailed calendar listing all scheduled hearings, mark-ups, and roundtables, including a list of witnesses;
- Statements of witnesses from past hearings;
- Press releases from the offices of the Chairman and the Ranking Member, Senator Edward Kennedy (D-MA);
- Biographies of each HELP Committee member;
- Websites for the Subcommittees on Bioterrorism and Public Health Preparedness, Education and Early Childhood Development, Employment and Workplace Safety, and Retirement Security and Aging; and,
- Links to related federal agencies.

The changes to the website will provide users with a wealth of resources to keep apprised of the important work of the HELP Committee.
