3 (a) RESTORING STAFFING LEVELS.—Not later than 4 7 days after the date of enactment of this Act, the Sec-5 retary of Education shall restore the Office for Civil 6 Rights staffing level to the level that existed on March 7 10, 2025. BOM25349 YP1

1 (b) BRIEFING BEFORE REDUCTION.—The Secretary 2 of Education shall not reduce or transfer staff from the 3 Office for Civil Rights of the Department of Education 4 until the Secretary carries out a briefing for the Com-5 mittee on Health, Education, Labor and Pensions of the 6 Senate and the Committee on Education and Workforce 7 of the House of Representatives that includes—

8 (1) an analysis of the impact that such reduc9 tion or transfer would have on resolving open inves10 tigations in a thorough and timely manner;

(2) an analysis of the impact that such a reduction or transfer would have on the ability of the Office for Civil Rights to provide institutions of higher
education with training, technical assistance, and
other supports that help institutions of higher education to comply with Federal civil rights laws; and

(3) a commitment to provide monthly briefings
to those Committees on the measured impact that
staff reductions have on the capacity of the Office
for Civil Rights to conduct timely and thorough investigations into violations of Federal civil rights
laws.
