Beginning not later than 30 days after the date of enactment of this Act and ending 5 years after the date of enactment of this Act, the Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights of the Department of Education shall provide to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor and Pensions BOM25306 799

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and the Committee on Appropriations of the Senate and 1 the Committee on Education and Workforce and the Com-2 mittee on Appropriations of the House of Representatives 3 a quarterly report on the monitoring and verification ac-4 tivities of the Office for Civil Rights of the Department 5 of Education (referred to in this section as "OCR") as 6 carried out under the Department of Education Office for 7Civil Rights Case Processing Manual (dated February 19, 8 2025), including, at a minimum, the following data: 9

(1) Data on the number of resolution agreements, by type of discrimination and in total, for
which a recipient has yet to fulfill the recipient's obligations under a resolution agreement.

14 (2) Data on actions taken by OCR to determine
15 whether a recipient that is a party to a resolution
16 agreement has complied with the terms and obliga17 tions of the resolution agreement, in total and by
18 type of discrimination.

(3) Data on deficiencies with respect to implementation of the terms and obligations of a resolution agreement by a recipient, in total and by type
of discrimination.

(4) The average time a resolution agreement remains open due to the failure of a recipient to fully
and effectively implement the terms and obligations
