2 **SEC. 6. INSPECTOR GENERAL AUDIT OF DOGE AT THE DE-**
3 **PARTMENT OF EDUCATION.**

4 Not later than 6 months after the date of enactment
5 of this section, the Inspector General of the Department
6 of Education shall submit to the Committee on Health,
7 Education, Labor and Pensions and the Committee on Ap-
8 propriations of the Senate and the Committee on Edu-

1 cation and Workforce and the Committee on Appropria-
2 tions of the House of Representatives, and make public
3 in a format that is widely accessible and publicly available,
4 a report containing the results of an audit examining—
5 (a) the resources, and the number of full-time equiva-
6 lent employees, of the Department of Government Effi-
7 ciency (referred to in this section as “DOGE”) that are,
8 at the time of the audit, or that have been at any time,
9 involved in the Department of Education;
10 (b) the involvement that DOGE employees have at
11 the time of the audit, or have had at any time, in decision-
12 making processes of the Department of Education or re-
13 garding the Department of Education;
14 (c) the impact of the Department of Education’s re-
15 duction in force actions on the capacity of the Department
16 of Education to execute statutorily required functions,
17 programs, and operations; and
18 (d) the increased risk of waste, fraud, abuse, and cor-
19 ruption, as a result of such reduction in force.
