5	(a) Gain-of-Function Research Definition.—In		
6	this section, the term "gain-of-function research" means		
7	any research that—		
8	(1) may be reasonably anticipated to confer at-		
9	tributes to influenza, MERS, or SARS viruses such		
10	that the virus would have enhanced pathogenicity or		
11	transmissibility in any organism; or		

(2) involves the enhancement of potential par	1-
demic pathogens or related risky research with po)-
tentially dangerous pathogens.	

(b) Funding Limitations.—

- (1) In GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no Federal funding made available to carry out any provision of this Act (including any amendments made by this Act) may be made available for any purpose, including under any contract, grant, subgrant, or other assistance, to laboratories or research institutions for the purposes of gain-of-function research.
- (2) CERTIFICATION.—Any recipient of funding from the Department of Health and Human Services for the purposes of scientific research shall certify to the issuing authority that such recipient will not distribute any such Federal funds, whether directly or through subgrants, to any qualifying laboratory or research institution for the purposes of gain-of-function research.
